Title: Renovate/Renew Academic Buildings Planning

#### **Justification Statement:**

This request is for authorization and funding for the Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University (208) Renovate/Renew Academic Buildings capital project to be included in House Bill 30, Item C-39 A Central Capital Planning Account.

This project is the university's second priority capital project and is critical to improving the instructional environment for students. The project will fully renovate and renew three existing academic buildings located in the core of main campus. The three buildings were constructed between 1899 and 1928, have had no major renovations or improvements since coming into service, and no longer house permanent occupants because of their deteriorated conditions. The facility condition index (value of outstanding repairs over building replacement value) of these buildings range from 56 percent to 78 percent, which reflects an extraordinary level of deterioration that may not be overcome with maintenance reserve work.

The three buildings in this package request are Davidson Hall-Front Section, Sandy Hall, and the Liberal Arts Building. Individually, these renovations are small projects and may be combined to a single package to achieve efficiencies in pricing through an attractive sized package, reduced general conditions fees, and compressing escalation with concurrent schedules. This renovation package provides a unique opportunity to bring three underutilized assets to high productivity, substantially reduce campus deferred maintenance, and solve several critical space needs without building additional campus space. The total project cost estimate is \$33.7 million, and the details of the project and its building components are described in the university's capital budget request in the Performance Budgeting System. Deferring refurbishment of these buildings may result in expensive leases to house academic programs and advanced deterioration that prohibits refurbishment because of eventual loss of building envelopes and foundations. This renovations project will renew the facilities and clear deferred maintenance effectively resetting their life expectancy.

This request includes supplemental nongeneral fund authorization to proceed from pre-planning to construction-ready documents. This may include proceeding through the end of preliminary designs and then to proceed through the end of detailed working drawings. This request includes appropriating \$2.1 million of nongeneral funds to supplement funds from the Central Planning Account for pre-planning as required for this purpose. Nongeneral funds expended for the purposes of the Renovate/Renew Academic Buildings project may be reimbursed from future General Fund appropriations as may be authorized for detail design of the project and for construction of the project for which planning is undertaken, upon the authorization of such funds.

This request for supplemental nongeneral fund authorization to continue planning through the end of detail working drawings uninterrupted is critical to the long-term success of the project. This

supplemental authorization will ensure continuity of the design process, continuity of the professional services design team, and continuity of key academic and administrative university stakeholders in the process. Because of the importance of this renovation project to the university's mission and strategic plan, the university may temporarily fund the planning work with nongeneral fund resources until such time as General Fund resources are sufficient and appropriated for the detail design phase and construction phase of the project.
